



The Generous Love of the Lord

Today we go on developing the notions of forgiveness and divine love that are the hallmarks of God's personality and his kingdom. When the ancient Israelites returned from exile, they hoped for the restoration of their kingdom, and the punishment of their enemies. But the



Lord had other plans. He was for mercy not vengeance, forgiveness not retribution (for my thoughts are not your thoughts, my ways not your ways). They were not to reclaim an earthly kingdom, but to be the witnesses of God's love, his saving ways in the world. The parable of the labourer in the vineyard illustrates something of the mercy of God's ways. In terms of economics, this seems a very strange arrangement; one might even feel it to be contrary to the standards of fairness we would expect as decent people. Everyone should be paid according to how much the work. But the point being made is that all are equally loved in God's kingdom. His love cannot be earned; human standards cannot be used to measure God's generosity.

God's ways are indeed above our ways, we demand justice, calculated giving, we prefer charity. The Lord is for boundless mercy, generosity, and infinite love. It seems wasteful and foolish in human terms, but this is how he is, in his creative and saving actions, loving and just in all his deeds.

By earthly standard it is a paradox; whether we live or die, both are equally for the Lord. This divine love is a mystery and it challenges human standards. We see it reflected in the lives of the great saints who have gone before us. God's justice, his care and respect for life and freedom, manifested in his law and prophets, and supremely in the life and teachings of Jesus, could never conform to a human program. They are a sign of contradiction and transformation in the world.


